The January issue (Volume 29, Number 1) of *Environmental History* will be on the way to members soon from the **University of Chicago Press**.

PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

The ASEH Executive Council is excited to report that we will be launching a new online open-access journal, *Environmental History Review*. Beginning in 2024, *EHR* will take advantage of web-based publication to publish born-digital work in a range of formats.

EHR is intended to complement, not compete with *Environmental History*, the flagship journal that we co-publish with the Forest History Society. Rather than long-form texts, *EHR* will provide space for multimedia projects, podcasts, videos, commentaries, interviews, teaching reflections, and review essays. With a quicker cycle than a traditional journal, it will foster topical commentary and discussion. We intend to feature environmental historians from within and beyond the academy with both peer-reviewed and non-peer reviewed work. *EHR* will serve as a public face of the ASEH and provide a lively and respectful forum for discussion among environmental historians.

The planning for this new journal began in 2022 when ASEH President Sarah Elkind named a committee to study the feasibility and need for an online journal. Executive Council members Peter Alagona, Catherine McNeur, and Edmund Russell produced an in-depth study that recommended that we embrace the potential of digital publication. They recognized the excellent online environmental history publications that already exist and concluded that there is room for another, especially one oriented toward linkage rather than competition. With the name *Environmental History Review* we honor the ASEH's first serial, the precursor to our current journal.

In 2023 a follow-up committee consisting of Peter Alagona, Sean Kheraj, Melanie Kiechle, Ruth Morgan, and Jay Turner devised a business plan, reporting structure, and launch procedures, which the Executive Council approved in October. The search committee for the inaugural editor is now in place with Catherine McNeur (chair), Lisa Brady, and Ramya Swayamprakash. They will publicize the job description and application process in January 2024.

The Executive Council left much about the format and content of the publication open to the inaugural editor. We expect *EHR* will be adaptable, open to risk-taking, and inclusive. To reduce barriers to participation, it will offer honoraria to junior and/or unemployed contributors. In addition, the ASEH will provide the editor-in-chief and two to three associate editors with a stipend; the positions will not require institutional support.

APPLICANTS SOUGHT FOR EDITOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL HISTORY REVIEW

Review of applications to begin on: February 1, 2024

The American Society for Environmental History seeks applicants to serve as Editor of the new digital journal *Environmental History Review* for a renewable three-year term beginning July 2024.

The *Environmental History Review (EHR)* will be the open-access digital publication of the American Society for Environmental History, existing as a space to exchange knowledge, respond to contemporary issues, and explore topics that connect the environmental present with its past. *EHR's* goals include the fast-paced publication of work by a wide range of environmental historians in formats and media that go beyond standard academic articles and reviews. While the *Environmental History Review* will include both peer-reviewed and non-peer reviewed work, itwill complement rather than compete with the work of *Environmental History.* The initial goal will be to publish content twice a week and provide a space to cultivate community.

The editor-in-chief will work with two to three associate editors and will be paid an annual stipend of \$6000. The associate editors as well as the social media outreach coordinator will also be compensated.

Qualifications

The ideal candidate must have:

- Recognized expertise in the field,
- A compelling vision for the future of the journal and the field,
- Managerial, organizational, editorial, and digital media skills to oversee the editorial cycle, meet deadlines, and work with publishing professionals,
- The ability to attract established and new scholars to contribute to the journal,
- Tact in communicating with authors and staff, and
- Membership in the ASEH.

Application Materials

The application package must include:

- Vision Statement that cohesively answers the following questions:
 - Where do you envision the *Environmental History Review* six years from now?

- How will the EHR differ from similar digital journals?
- How do you plan to collaborate and build relationships with *Environmental History* and other environmental history publications and efforts?
- Why are you considering this role at this moment in your career?
- Curriculum vitae that highlights publications, editorial experience, and links to any digital portfolios

Search Procedure

Review of applications will begin on February 1, 2024. Finalists will be interviewed remotely over Zoom or at the ASEH meeting in Denver, Colorado, April 3-7, 2024.

Applications must be submitted as a single PDF file with the file name "yourlastname_EHReditor.pdf" to the chair of the search committee, Catherine McNeur (catherine.mcneur@pdx.edu).

Together with ASEH, our campaign to raise \$150,000 for both new and longstanding ASEH initiatives, has had a very successful year.
